INCORPORATING CHANGES UP TO 31 OCTOBER 2019

This *Update* covers the 2020 editions of the *Architects'* and *Builders' Price Book*, the *Civil Engineering* and *Highway Works Price Book*, the *External Works* and *Landscape Price Book* and the *Mechanical* and *Electrical Services Price Book*. Details of changes in material prices, wage rates, etc., are given and the various indices and adjustment factors presented in the books are brought up to date.

Each of the Price Books is dealt with separately in its own section of the *Update*. Information on changes to the *Architects' and Builders' Price Book* appears on pages 3 to 4, the *Civil Engineering and Highway Works Price Book* on pages 5 to 6, the *External Works and Landscape Price Book* on page 7, and the *Mechanical and Electrical Services Price Book* on page 8.

Corrections are headed 'Erratum' and boxed to distinguish them from updated information.

Spon's 2021 Price Books are planned to be published in September 2020.

The Construction Climate

Construction activity trends

Headline construction new work output posted a modicum of growth in 2019 Q3 measured year-on-year. It is expansion all the same, and positive news is reassuring to offset uncertainty elsewhere. However, the annual rate of change in growth was slower than that posted in 2019 Q1 by a factor of almost a half. Additionally, the quarter-on-quarter change, which was negative in 2019 Q2, showed an increase to 0.6% for 2019 Q3.

Tender prices increased by 2.8% over the year at 2019 Q3. Commercial supply chain pressures moved prices higher annually, but now with less speed on a quarter-to-quarter basis.

Building cost index

Materials and labour input costs continue to rise. A composite index for building costs at 2019 Q3 is up by 3.7% since the same quarter a year ago.

Materials

Construction material prices rose on a yearly basis. The 'All Work' construction material price index increased by less than 1% in October 2019 compared to a year earlier with 25% of materials showing a reduction.






